To make this journey possible, Sébastien is seeking sponsorship to fund this transformative training and bring its benefits back to Mauritius through education, cultural development, and musical innovation.

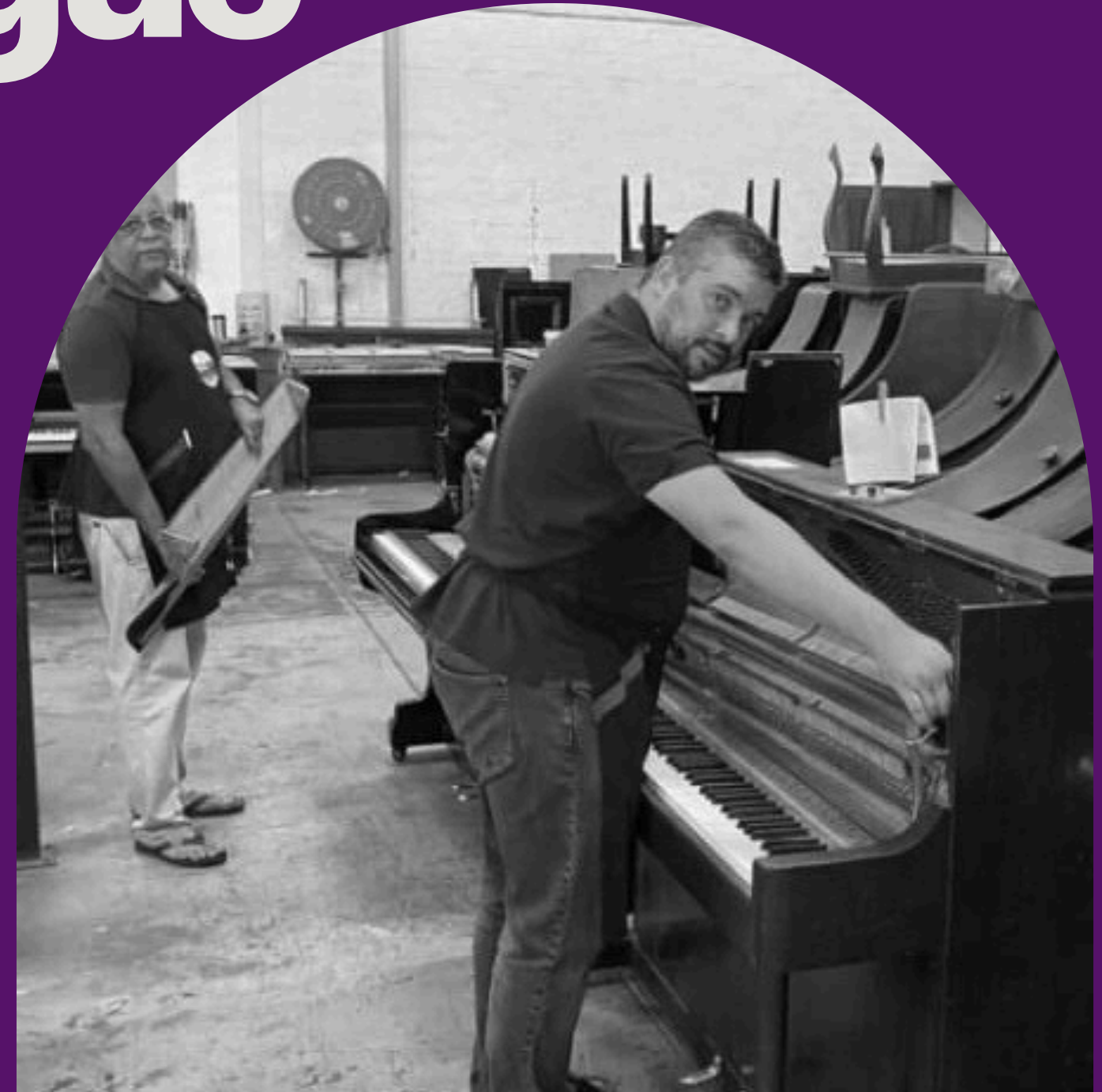


About Sébastien Domingue

Sébastien is a multifaceted artist: a composer, pianist, piano tuner, and founder of the Philharmonia LTD. His musical journey began at the age of three, and he has trained under acclaimed mentors in Mauritius and the UK. He is the creator of Classéga, an innovative fusion of classical music and Sega, Mauritius' iconic traditional genre. His career includes landmark contributions:

- Composer of the MRA Anthem and Latanier d'Argent for Emtel
- Arranger for national events like Independence Day celebrations
- Conductor of the Winterthur Youth Orchestra (Switzerland)
- Collaborations with international artists including Pascal Obispo and Ádám György
- Author and composer of "La Racine des Mots," performed during the first edition of Porlwi by Light festival

Duration: 15 September 2025 – 31 August 2026 (1 year, hybrid: 2 onsite + 2 online trimesters)

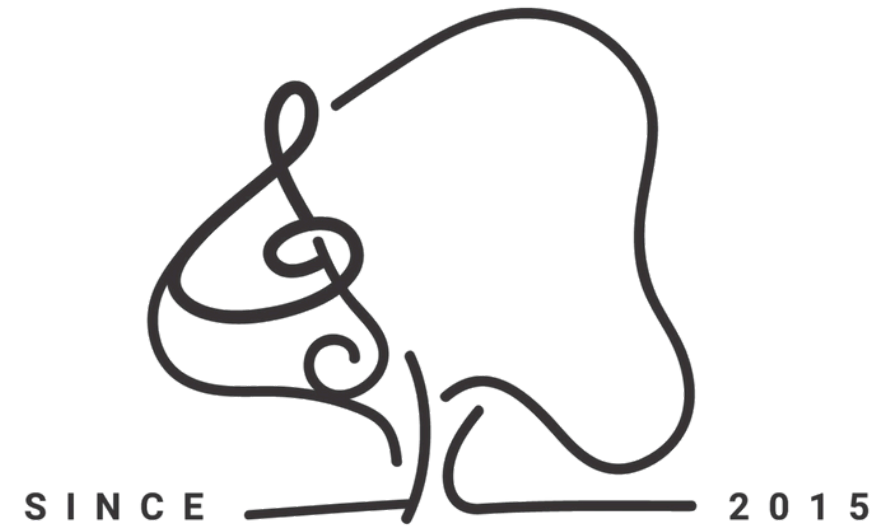
